MATTER, ATTENDANCE

COUNTS.

Improving school attendance is everyone's business and, to tackle the challenge we face, we need to work together. From 8 January, the Government is launching a national campaign to remind parents and carers of the importance of school attendance. The campaign strapline is "moments matter, attendance counts"

"From the first day of term to the last, the small moments in a school day make a real difference to your child. #AttendanceCounts!"

The link between attendance and attainment is clear:

In 2018/19, just 40% of persistently absent (PA) children in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who were regular attenders.

But attendance is important for more than just attainment:

Regular school attendance can facilitate positive peer relationships, which is a protective factor for mental health and wellbeing.

Contact Details

Please make sure that the school has your most up to date contact details AND two emergency contact numbers for your child. It is essential that you provide the office with this information and they you let them know of any changes when the occur.
