## Secondary School Applications

If you have a child in Year 6 you will be thinking carefully about which secondary school to apply for. You will need to complete an online application form. We will be holding daily drop in workshops on 16th, 17th, 18th, 19th and 20th October, from 9.00 a.m.-10.30 a.m. where members of staff will be able to advise you and help you to complete the online application form. In order for you to be able to complete the application form you will also need to make sure that you bring the following information in with you: your email address, two bills that have your address on them, your child's birth certificate and a council tax bill.

A couple of parents have asked why we no longer arrange for individual photos to be taken of children. Over the years we have found it very time consuming and disruptive to the learning day to organise individual photos for children. In the past, studio photos were very expensive to buy but now it much more affordable for parents and carers to organise for their child to have their child's photo taken themselves if they choose to. What is more difficult for parents and carers is organising to have a photo of their child with their whole class, their teacher and support staff. Therefore, instead of taking the view that it is not the job of a school to provide this service we decided to only have whole class photos which parents can choose to buy. The photos will arrive at school before October half term and proofs will be sent home along with order forms.

Please make sure that you pay your child's school dinner money into the main office ideally at least one week in advance. If you are unsure about whether your child qualifies for Free School Meals, please come and speak to the office staff about it. They will be able to help you.
